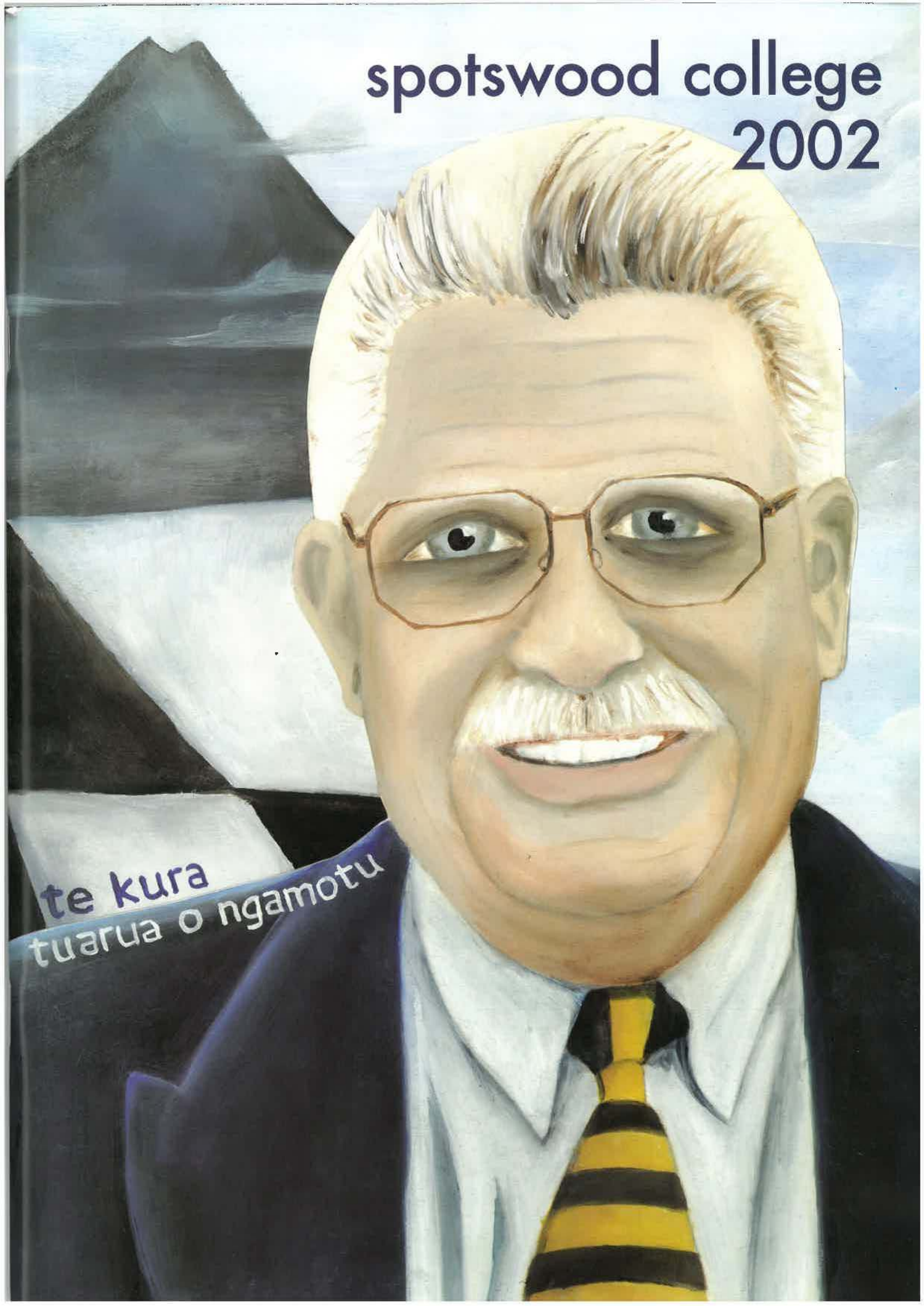

Principal's Report 2002



I am pleased to present my 16th and final report as Principal of Spotswood College and to comment on what has been in general another most successful year.

It was particularly pleasing to see a continuation of the small but steady roll growth we had been experiencing over the previous years. Year 9, 10 and 11 numbers are all around the 200 mark and indicating that if the trend continues in 2003 we could well see our roll grow to the mid 900s over the next two to three years.

Staffing:

We were fortunate to start the year fully staffed after a number of vacancies were notified at the end of 2002.

New appointments for 2002 were:

- Ms Sarah Arnold (English), replacing Ms Jane Waller who moved to the UK to further her teaching careers overseas.
- Ms Kara O'Halloran (PE), replacing Ms Kerry Eagar who joined Jane Waller in the UK.
- Mrs Carolyn Miles (HOD TIM), replacing our long serving Margaret Gaze who left teaching to move into the public arena.
- Mr Kevin Rowlands (Technology), a long-term relief position replacing HOD Mr Dennis Ingram who has a years leave to work as a Technology Advisor at the Wellington College of Education.
- Mr Andrew Flynn (Technology), in a new position.

Two further appointments were also made, both fixed term for 2003, to ensure class sizes were kept low and to assist with the introduction of a second Whanau Class.

They were:

- Mr Wilson Han (Mathematics and Science)
- Ms Melissa Goodin (Social Studies and Maori)

During the year Mrs Helen Cook (Mathematics) left to take up a position in Auckland and was replaced by Mr Phillip Whittaker. Mrs Deborah Evans left on maternity leave and was replaced by Ms Susan Quigley.



Other Staffing

From the beginning of 2002 I made a change to the Senior Management team with Mr Matthew Cooper being appointed Assistant Principal.

The school was also pleased to welcome two "new members" during 2002. To Nicola and Wayne baby Maruata Ngarewa born 20th March 2002 and to Deborah and Graeme baby William Evans born 25th May 2002. Special congratulations to both families from the staff of Spotswood College.

A special tribute is paid to Dianne Snowdon, a staff member in various capacities since 1995, who passed away in March of this year. After battling invasive cancer for over nine years Dianne passed away peacefully at home just two weeks after relinquishing her job at the Taranaki Activity Centre. She is sadly missed by all who knew her.

Our Sports Co-ordinator, Ms Leigh Laurence, left to take up an appointment in Wellington and was replaced by Mr Kevin Saunders.



Students:

I am pleased to report another successful year for our students who were engaged in external examinations. Our overall pass rate increased from 60.4% in 2000 to 63.1% to continue a trend over the last few years of incremental but significant improvement.

Top performing students in terms of pass rates (students greater than 50% in the exams) were:

Special mention must go to a number of students in our Special Education Department who with great assistance from their teachers and Teacher Aides were able to present themselves in a limited range of School Certificate subjects. Six students presented nine subjects, with all but one passing and an overall average of 63%. A credit to them and to the school!

At Bursary level the number of students and hence the number of papers sat, was down from 2000 but overall our % success increased significantly. The overall pass rate (mark greater than 50%) increased from 67% in 2000 to 72.5%.

Our students also were awarded nine Scholarships compared to five in 2000 and were only headed by one other school in Taranaki who had almost three times the number of candidates.

Our top student Tessa Versteeg gained four Scholarships averaging 90.5%. Truly outstanding and cementing her as one of New Zealand's top scholars. Other Scholarship winners were:

While our academic successes were impressive so too were the achievements of our students in a wide range of cultural, sporting and leadership activities.

Special congratulations to Amanda Brien and Russell Dalton appointed Head Prefects and Lisa Kerr and Luke Allen their Deputies for their work and support throughout the year.





I also acknowledge the outstanding effort of our school Kapa Haka, our numerous school bands and all those involved in our highly successful drama groups.

I would also congratulate our new Sports Co-ordinator, Mr Kevin Saunders, for a great effort in co-ordinating the teams involved in a wide range of sporting pursuits, representing our school throughout the year.

A special mention to all the Coaches, Managers and supporters, without whom we would simply be unable to operate.



Property:

This year saw us finally complete the Technology Block complex. With the sealing and landscaping of the area, we can now reflect on what has been a truly outstanding development. The facilities are still rated as one of the most innovative and exciting in the country.

During the early part of 2002 we were able to complete the upgrade of our Music faculty and provide some much-needed expansion into the high tech computer based editing and recording elements of modern music.

Plans are now underway to complete the landscaping in the front of the school adjacent to the main entrance. Included in this development will be a long awaited bus shelter situated at the Western end of the Bus Bay. Hopefully construction will be completed by the end of this school year.

Part of the top floor of B Block has been renovated to accommodate and develop an "English Language School" to cater for our increasing number of overseas students, both fee paying and exchange, whose first language is not English.



Key Initiatives For 2002:

Implementation of NCEA Level One has been somewhat problematical this year. While teachers and students have worked hard to successfully translate to the new assessment system there have been a number of areas causing concern. We identified workload issues for both students and teachers as perhaps the most worrying aspect of the new system. Any new system will of course have teething problems, however, I have a concern that the underlying issue of workload may be difficult to deal with as by definition any system which has a significant element of internal assessment will automatically produce a greater time commitment for all. Careful guidance and a ruthless excising of unnecessary assessment will be required if the system is to be at all manageable.

Issues with faulty assessment tasks being published on the Ministry of Education Web and the protracted contract negotiations between the Post Primary Teachers Association and the Ministry of Education have set a climate of unease this year. Careful analysis of the results from this year will be essential if teachers, students and the community are to have confidence that NCEA is indeed a fair, rigorous and robust qualification.



Our team working on expanding the overseas student base at our school have had a successful year. Targets have been reached and we are looking forward to consolidating the programme during 2003. Finding Homestays for our fee-paying students will ultimately be the limiting factor for total numbers we can accept at our school.



Thanks:

After 34 years at Spotswood College, of which 16 have been spent as Principal, I will be retiring at the end of 2002. I wish to sincerely thank and acknowledge all those students, staff, parents, community and board members who have given me outstanding support and guidance throughout my career. This is a fine school with a fine reputation, a school which I have been proud to lead and be associated with for so long.

My best wishes to all for the challenge and excitement that lies ahead. I am confident that the new Principal will have the full support of this wonderful community and will continue to place Spotswood College at the forefront of our New Zealand Education system.

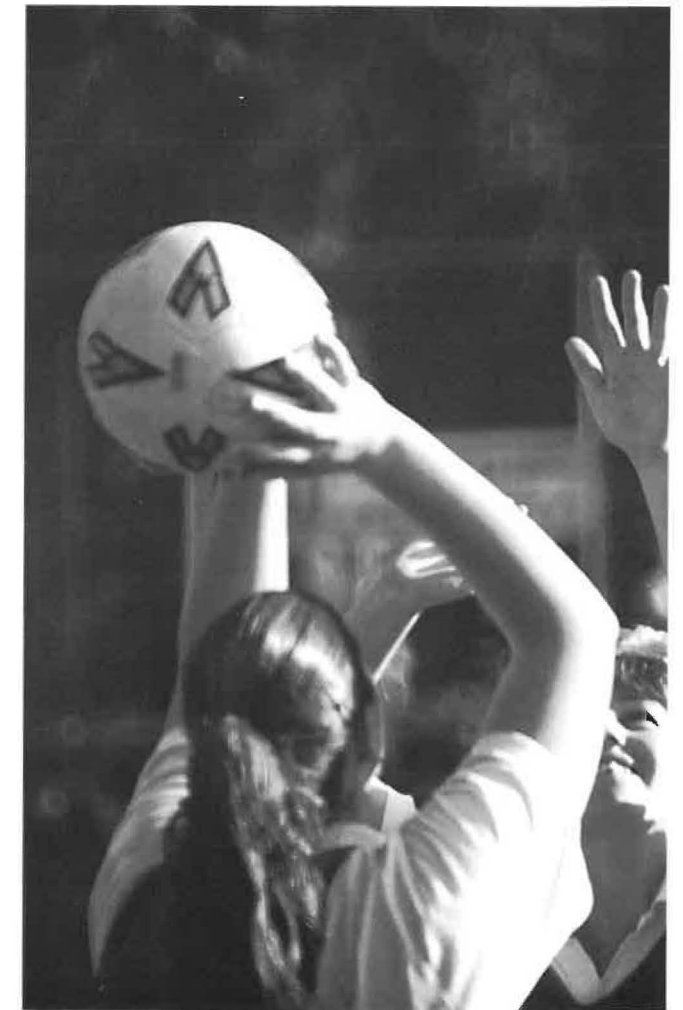

Barry Finch



Barry joined the staff as a young teacher in 1969, teaching in the Mathematics and Physics Faculty. At the end of that year his expertise had been recognised and he gained a PR2 in Maths and Physics. In 1984 he was appointed Deputy Principal. Prior to that he was HOD of the Maths Department and House Leader of Atkinson House. Barry became Principal of Spotswood College in 1987.

In such a long and distinguished career it is difficult to pick out highlights, but Barry has identified one as being involved in the piloting of the new Maths and Physics curricula along with the professional development that went with it as one of his treasured times.

Another career highlight was being appointed Principal of Spotswood College. Barry hadn't intended staying so long at the school but when the opportunity came he was really happy to accept it as it meant keeping his family together.

Teaching such an enormously talented group of young people throughout his years at Spotswood Barry also saw as extremely gratifying. Barry follows many of their careers today – from all over the world – in their high profile positions. These people were the crème de la crème and really high achievers who were both challenging and stimulating to teach.

And has teaching changed? Yes – from a strict rigid curriculum with fewer options for students but which were taught to a higher level than present. This was brought about because students began to stay at school longer therefore it became necessary to offer greater diversity of subjects.

A very important personal highlight was the introduction and development of the Special Needs Department in 1987 – 88. This development has

continued with Spotswood College being a fund holder for many schools, and was motivated by seeing young people who could benefit from a mainstream education with appropriate support. Spotswood College is now recognised as one of the best, if not the best provider of Special Education in New Zealand.

Outside school Barry has many interests. He has had a long involvement with Basketball enticing Steve McKean to New Plymouth to coach the BP Bears and the setting up of the National Basketball League with Steve. Dillon Boucher a current "Tall Black" is a product of Spotswood College and a current staff member Daryn Shaw, is a Tall Black player from previous years.

Another highlight was that Barry was able to have both his own children at Spotswood College while he was Deputy Principal and then Principal. That they were both comfortable in the school reflects the inclusive and accepting nature of the Spotswood College community.

The modernisation of the school has also been important. The past 11 years have seen upgrades of all blocks and the redesigning of the Technology Block – still regarded as a model worthy of emulation. Bulk funding also played an important part in being able to develop our own designs to suit Spotswood College.

A real highlight in terms of Barry's professional teaching is that he realised limitations in his skills but had the insight to employ high quality people to be part of the school management team, which is why the school has been so successful. He is very accepting of the strengths of those around him and uses these strengths for the betterment of the school. It is a credit to Barry that those Deputy Principals and Assistant Principals have gone on to greater things.

Outside school interests - Barry has a keen interest in CB radio and is involved in Civil Defence and of course is on the New Plymouth District Council.

And plans for the future? Barry will continue to work with the New Plymouth District Council and there are some "irons in the fire" but time with family, wife Corrina, son Greg and daughter Michelle and grandchildren Laura, William and Benjamin is high on the list of priorities and after them electronics, radio, gardening and woodworking. However 34 years at Spotswood College is a big part of his life and it will be very hard for Barry not to be involved in some way.

A final message to all those students and teachers who have worked with him at Spotswood College - a very big thank you.

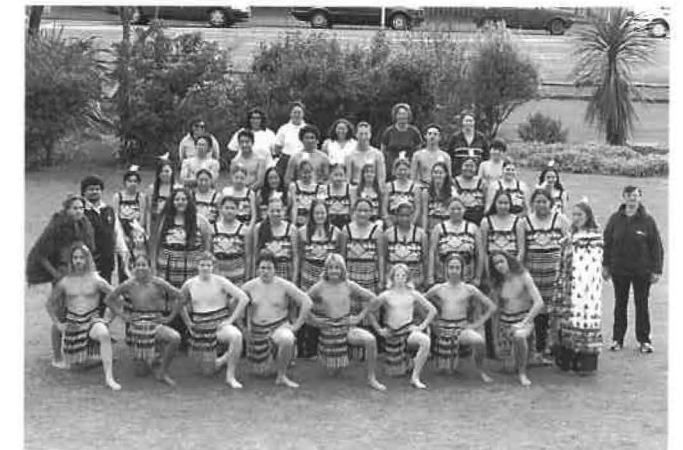
Anyway after Paerangatahi we have just one and a half weeks to get ready for Manu Ariki so the race is on.

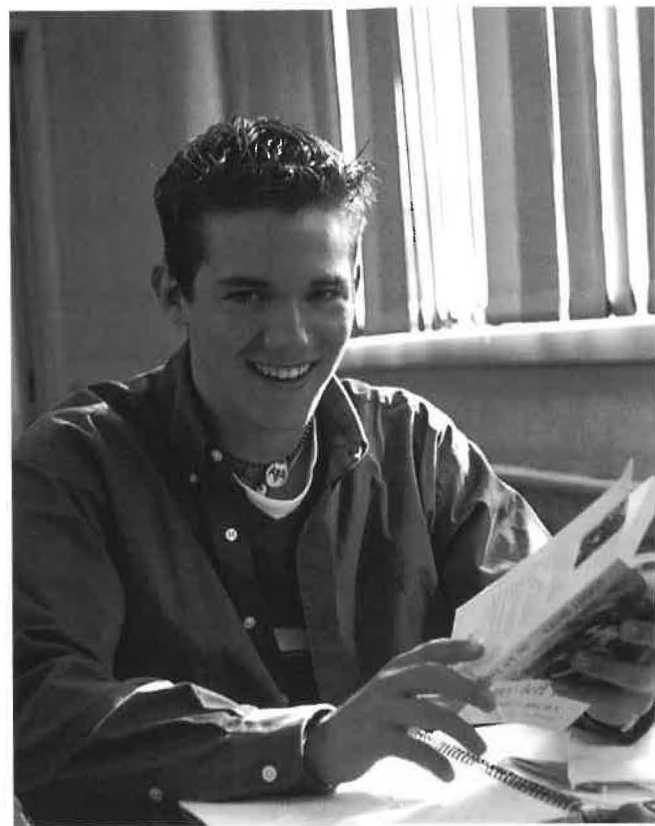
Katrine Lund

The three leads, Makere Abraham, Jackson Coe and Toni Short were the kind of 'Bones' who were prepared to take responsibility for the plight of the earth and share its resources generously. Never mind that Jackson's character was a bit of a wimp, Makere, as Gen, was a natural born streetfighter, and Toni's persona died in the end - she bled to death after being stabbed by the machete-wielding Jenny.

Other 'Corpras' were Nikhil George, Jack Turner and Toby FitzPatrick, and they were always chasing, threatening, shouting at, insulting, beating up the rest of the 'Bones'; Steven McGiven, Sylvia Avery, Michelle Lotter, Vanessa Martin, Jessica Kilpatrick, Bethel Hawksworth and Rosie Shanks, who all had to look hungry, exhausted, frightened all the time.

The set looked great because of the professional lighting - use plenty of red was the motto - it is the colour of blood! The stage looked great because of the costumes. Interestingly the cast made their own costumes and props, or rather they destroyed other costumes to create their own. They were a mess, but that was what they were supposed to look like.

All in all the cast and crew, students and staff - and plenty of really great helpers backstage! - worked for three months and showed that year nine to year thirteen students and incredibly clever staff can work together, laugh together and produce good quality theatre together. If I have missed anyone out in this brief record that is a shame because everyone played their part - even the cat!

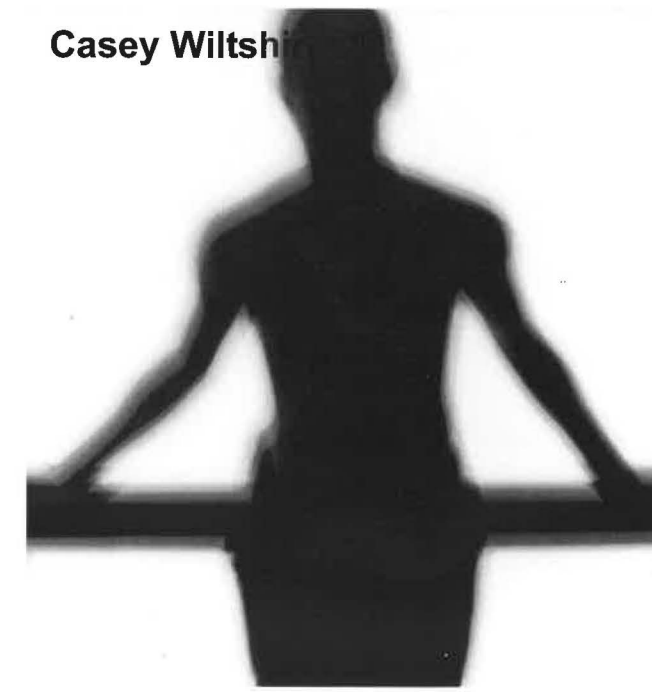

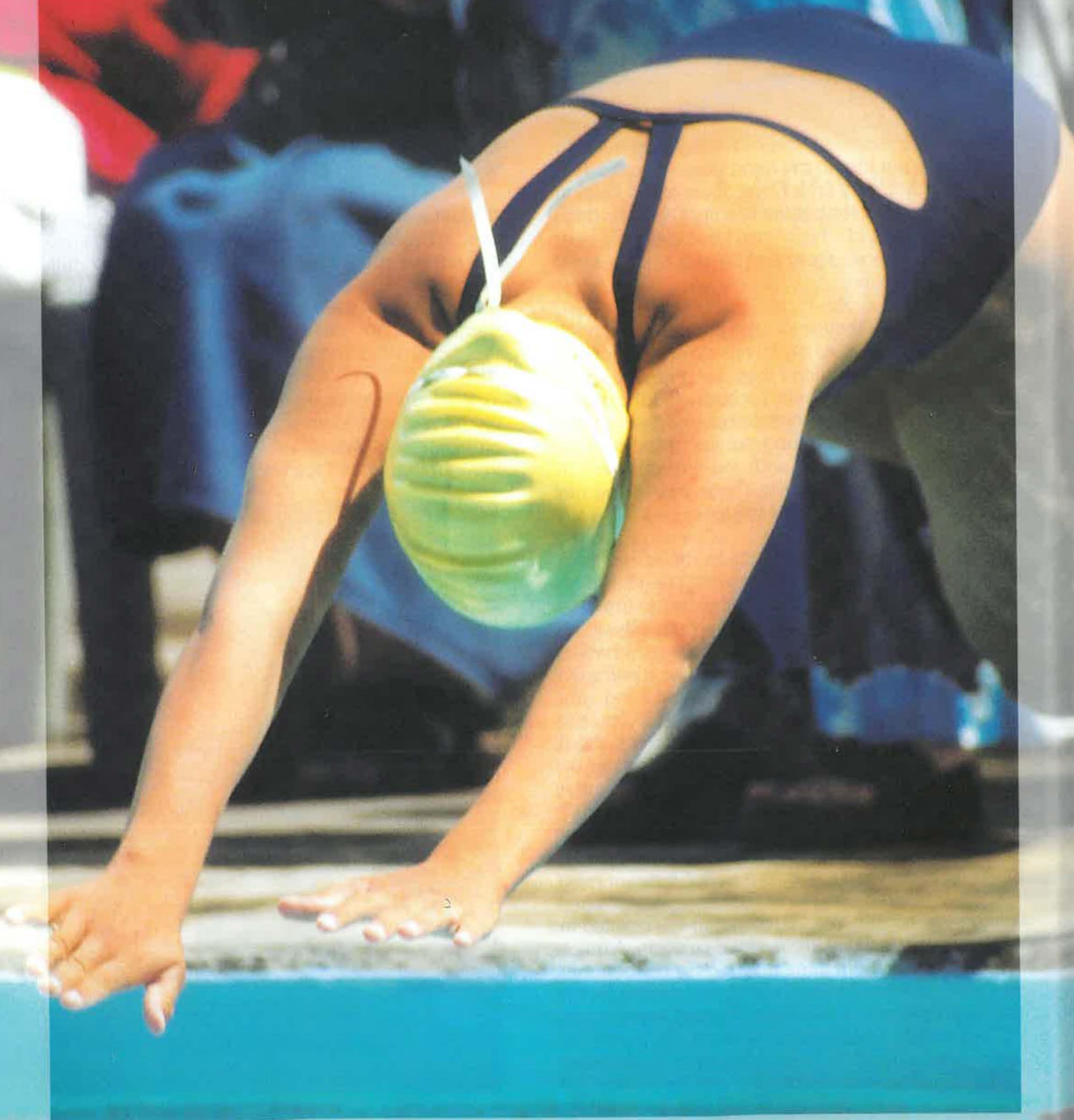
As if that's any consolation.

It is again with great pleasure that we can report on another very successful year for the various girls' teams that have represented Spotswood College at Volleyball during the last twelve months.

The major highlights during the past year were:

Phillipa Soulsby was the National winner of the 2001 Sunday Star/Times-Sportfit Future Champions Award making her the top female secondary schools Volleyball player in New Zealand for 2001. Rebecca Reidy was awarded a Highly Commended certificate.

Rebecca Reidy was awarded a Prime Minister's Sports Scholarship for 2002.

The 2001 Junior Girls' A team winning the Taranaki Regional Qualifying series and going on to finish in 13th place in Division One at the North Island Secondary Schools Championships at Tauranga.

Phillipa Soulsby and Rebecca Reidy won the 2001 North Island Secondary Schools Senior Girls' Beach Volleyball Championships played at Ngamotu Beach in early-December.

Phillipa Soulsby and Rebecca Reidy won the 2001 New Zealand Secondary Schools Senior Girls' Pairs Beach Volleyball Championships played at Mt. Maunganui. They are the first pair (boys' or girls') to win a title three consecutive times since the Championships were first played for in 1997. This is a feat that may never be bettered.

The senior girls' team won the 2002 Taranaki regional qualifying series undefeated to qualify to play in Division One at the NZSS championships in Palmerston North where they finished in 20th place.

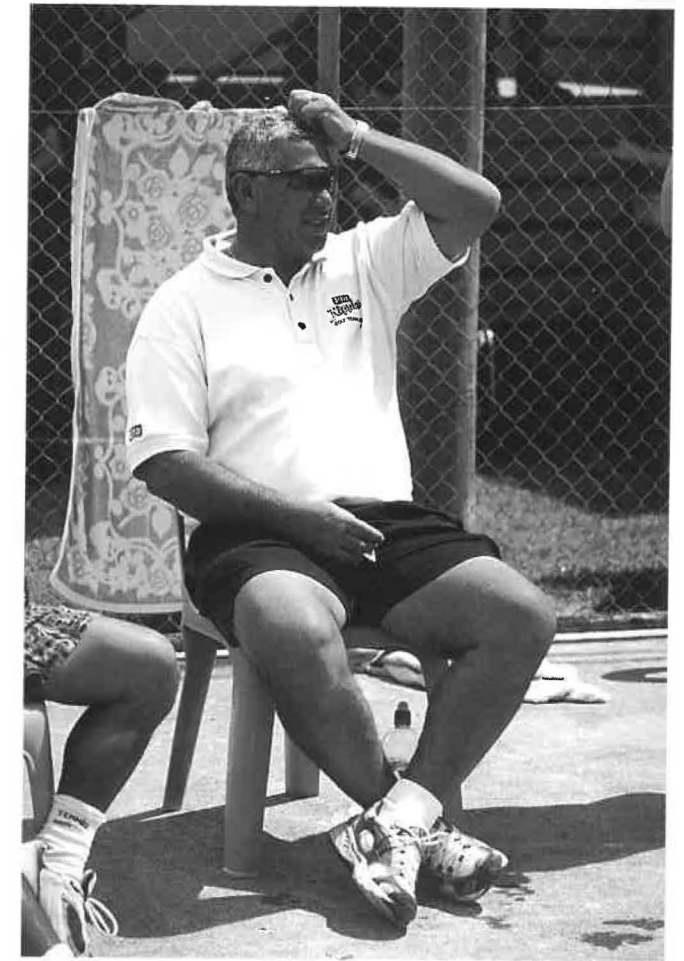

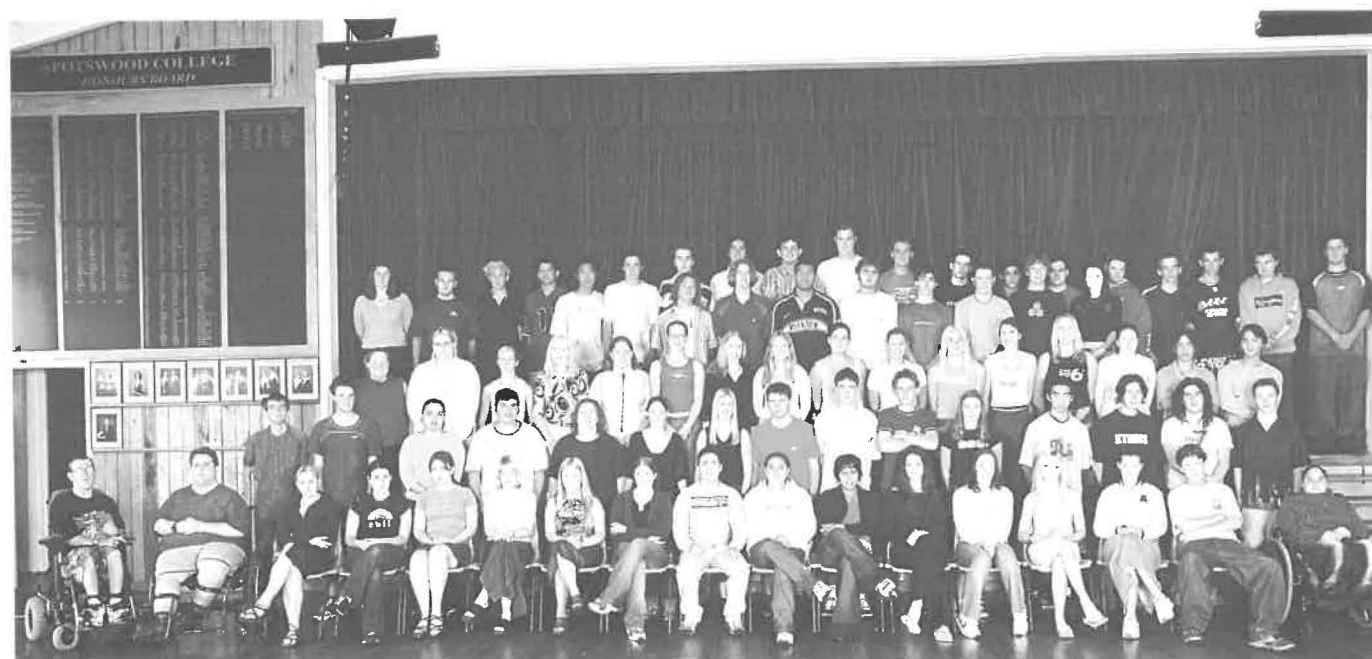

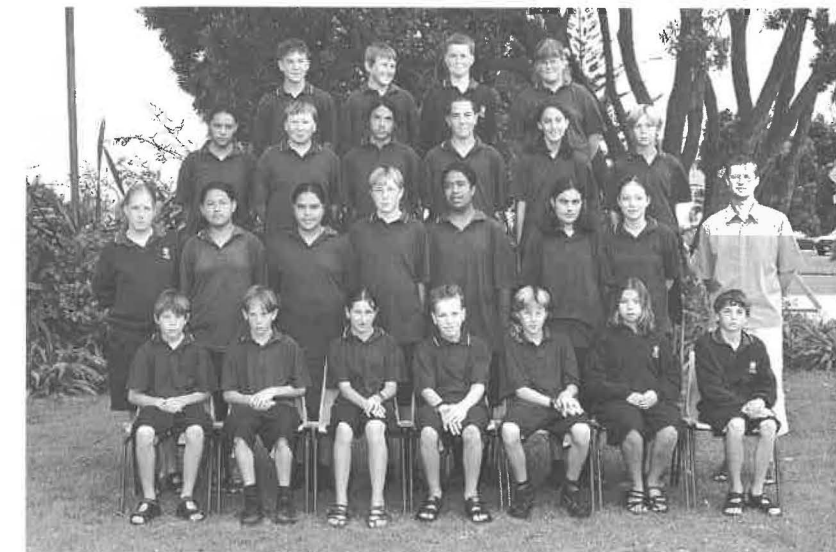
